

Lenoir/Michal Cemetery Established 1880

Deed written 1882 on behalf of the daughters of Thomas Isaac Lenoir, Mary Lenoir Michal, Laura Lenoir, Sara Lenoir Hickerson. Land gifted to the Protestant Episcopal Diocese of Western NC with 2 acres in trust as graveyard for descendants of Thomas Isaac Lenoir and his family.

Family Home and land: Original home was a log cabin on the family plantation built and owned by Colonel Thomas Lenoir (1780-1861) and Selina Louisa Avery Lenoir. The land was a wedding gift from Selina's father, Col Waightstill Avery (1741-1821) who once owned around 5,000 acres in this area. Thomas and Selina left the area and headed back to the family home at Fort Defiance to raise their children and provide advanced education. Their son Thomas Isaac Lenoir returned to the family plantation as an adult and managed it and lived there until his death. He called his home "The Den". Thomas Isaac is buried in the family graveyard.

John McDowell Michal Sr. (1863-1928) married Mary Lenoir, the daughter of Thomas Isaac Lenoir and The family lived in a Hunting Lodge called Chesquea Lodge on the forks of the Pigeon River in early 1900s.

He lived in Haywood County, N.C. on the Fork of the Pigeon operating his father's plantation. In 1861 he married Mary Elizabeth Garrett of Lenoir; N.C. Lenoir served in the Company F of the 25th Regiment of the Confederate Army from 1861 to 1862 as Company Captain.

Family History:

Thomas Isaac Lenoir (1817-1882) was the son of Colonel Thomas and Selina Louisa Avery Lenoir of Fort Defiance in Caldwell County, N.C.

Thomas Isaac Lenoir's father, Thomas Lenoir (1780-1861) was an Army officer, of Caldwell Co., N.C. Historical Papers on Thomas Lenoir are housed at the University of NC Library. <u>Thomas Lenoir papers</u>, 1771-1912 - Archives & Manuscripts at Duke University Libraries

Thomas Isaac Lenoir was the grandson of General William Lenoir and Col. Waightstill Avery.

General William Lenoir (B. 5/8/1751) General Lenoir's portrait appears in Wilson Library at UNC/CH where he was Chairman of the first Board of Trustees of the University. A Revolutionary War general, his home "Fort Defiance" is on the National Registry & a "must-see" for family members.

William Lenoir (May 8, 1751 – May 6, 1839) was an American Revolutionary War officer and prominent statesman in late 18th-century and early 19th-century North Carolina. Both the City of Lenoir, North Carolina and Lenoir County, North Carolina are named for him.[1] Additionally, Lenoir City, Tennessee is jointly named for him and for his son, William Ballard Lenoir. The USS Lenoir (AKA-74) was also (indirectly) named for him.

After the formation of the NC state government, **Col Waightstill Avery** was elected to the first General Assembly, which met at New Bern in 1777; by that body he was named the first attorney general of North Carolina. Avery County was named after Colonel Waightstill Avery. Waightstill Avery, one of eleven children, was born to Humphrey and Jerusha Morgan Avery. May 10, 174 in Groton, Connecticut. His great, great grandfather, Christopher Avery had reached Massachusetts in the Puritan migration of the 1630's. He was from the Parish of Ipplepen in Devonshire, England



Michal Family History:

Dr. George W Michal Parents: Jacob Michal (1792-1834) and Catherine Ramsaur (1796-1869) Rutherfordton.

George W Michal's Grandparents: Migrating to North Carolina from Pennsylvania colony, Johan Conrad Michal (1763-1839) and Maria Sabina Hoke "Sarah" (1770-1850) Rutherfordton, buried in what is now Lincolnton, NC. Johan Conrad's sons were Jacob and William, and the home of William still exists as a pre-civil war historic building in Lincoln County NC. Two other Michal homes, the older most likely being that of Johan Conrad Michal.

George W Michal's Grandparents: Paulas Michel (1708-1768) and Magdalena Elizabeth Bachmann (1730-1790) migrated from Germany about 1739.

The parents of **Martha McDowell Michal** were: John Moffett McDowell (February 9, 1787-June 16, 1855) and Mary Mansfield Lewis (September 18, 1790-Nov 25, 1872)

The grandparents of Martha McDowell Michal were Col. Joseph McDowell (February 26, 1758-1795 or 1799) And Mary Moffett (December 28, 1768-July 6, 1825)

Col. Joseph McDowell, son of "Hunting" John and Annie Edmiston McDowell, was born February 26, 1758. He was educated in Virginia and was a physician and lawyer by profession. On April 27, 1786, he married his cousin Mary Moffitt of Augusta County, Virginia. Mary Moffitt was a granddaughter of Ephriam McDowell. Joseph was a captain in the Battle of Kings Mountain and commanded a company. He was later promoted to major during the Revolutionary War. After the Battle of Kings Mountain, when the spoils were divided, a portion of a set of General Ferguson's china was given to him. It is now in the North Carolina Museum in Raleigh, NC. After the Revolutionary War, he was given the title of Colonel. Colonel Joseph McDowell distinguished himself as a legislator in the North Carolina House of Commons from Burke County in 1787, 1788, 1791 and 1792. Then he was elected to represent this area in the 3rd United States Congress of 1793-1795. He was appointed to a commission to settle the boundary lines between North Carolina and Tennessee. In 1780, Colonel Joseph McDowell built what is now known as the McDowell House in Marion, NC in the Federal style. He named it Pleasant Gardens. Colonel Joseph and Mary Moffitt had three children: John, Anne and James. When McDowell County was organized in 1843, it was named for Joseph McDowell. He was regarded as one of the most prominent men in the Upper Catawba Valley. Colonel Joseph McDowell died March 7, 1799, and was buried in the Round Hill burial plot on the former McDowell property with other members of the McDowell family.

Mrs. Michal died suddenly on Monday at the home of her daughter and son-in-law, Dr. Martha Wood and Dr. Frank Wood in Marion, where she had been residing since the death of her husband John McDowell Michal several years ago. Prior to her residence in Marion, Mrs. Michal lived at the Michal home on Pigeon, now occupied by one of her sons.

Mrs. Michal was the daughter of the late Captain Thomas Issac Lenoir and Elizabeth Garrett Lenoir. She had spent the greater part of her life in Haywood County.

She was known as a talented painter, but following her marriage, she gave up all outside interests to devote her time to her family.














